CLASS OF 2021 OPHELIA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

For a fifth consecutive year, The OPHELIA Foundation has awarded \$1,000 scholarships to three college-bound high school seniors. The Foundation awarded the scholarships to these outstanding students to help them meet the ever-rising costs of pursuing a higher education.
